The Third Sunday of Advent is *Gaudete* Sunday, a Sunday of rejoicing. The Church, the People of God, rejoices in salvation from sin, inviting everyone to rejoice and create conditions that the salvation brought by the Lord Jesus may be shared by all.

1st Reading: Isaiah 61:1-2,10-11

Response: My soul rejoices in my God.

2nd Reading: 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24

Alleluia: The Spirit of the Lord is upon

me; he sent me to bring Good

REJOICE THE LORD IS NEAR...

The third Sunday of Advent is traditionally called *Gaudete Sunday*. *Gaudete* is the Latin word meaning "rejoice." This Sunday is so named because "Rejoice" is the first word in the entrance antiphon for today's Mass taken from Philippians 4:4,5: "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice! The Lord is near." Some people mark this Sunday on their Advent wreath with a pink candle instead of a purple candle. This Sunday is a joyful reminder that our salvation is near.

Today we hear about the coming of John the Baptist and his announcement of the Messiah, Jesus. The "light" in the beginning of this passage refers to Jesus, the eternal Word of God. This Gospel makes clear that John is not the Messiah but came to prepare the way for Jesus, the Christ. People were wondering about the identity of John. He was certainly creating quite a stir by his preaching and baptizing. The Jews were expecting the Messiah to come, so they wondered if John might be him. But John makes clear he is not.

Furthermore, with the coming of the Messiah, the Jews were anticipating the return of the great Prophet Elijah. But John makes clear he is not him either. Nor is he "the Prophet," another expected figure in the Messianic age. He, in fact, is the forerunner to the Messiah. John certainly had a prophetic and even Elijah-like role (interestingly, if we read carefully some of the texts about John we see that he dressed like Elijah [camel's hair and a leather belt] and had the same diet as Elijah [locusts and wild honey]), but he did not want in any way to take away attention from Jesus. He was not the focus. Rather, his role was to help the people be ready for the Messiah. Jesus had grown up among the people but his true identity as the Messiah was not revealed until his baptism by John and his following public ministry. John acknowledged the greatness of Jesus and announced his coming, calling the people to repent so their hearts would be ready to encounter God in the flesh. In a similar way, we are called to prepare our hearts during Advent through repentance as we prepare to encounter Christ in Christmas.


