
How many times in your life have you ever desired to be called? Maybe you waited upon a favourable response after a hopeful job interview? Perhaps you have auditioned for a play or school musical or tried out for an athletic team, and you waited on pins and needles for that affirming call from a director or coach, "You're in!" What excitement you felt when you received the call from someone who affirmed your worth!

This Sunday, too, is moment of joy and gladness. You are invited to receive a wonderful call. Advent is about the coming of Jesus as our Saviour. He calls to us and reaches out to us, down to us, drawing us closer to Himself. Advent invites us to prepare ourselves to hear the glorious call and for the world to receive the Saviour.

The Prophet Baruch reminds us that God is leading Israel in joy by the light of his glory, with his mercy and justice for company. Probably it is difficult for us to sense this message in our hearts. We are Israel, you and I. God is calling us to follow Him, in joy by the light of His glory. We can only know this by faith in the Lord. We Christians are invited to answer His call through belief in Jesus and to believe that Jesus has come for the salvation of the world through His Advent. Our faith in the call, Christ's coming into the world, and that it has changed the world is challenged daily. Through news channels, the internet, and social media we absorb sometimes horrid news about pain, suffering and death and we wonder — where is God? Abject poverty, terrorism, hate crimes, and abuses of all forms shake our faith. We persevere in His Advent, our faith hard-wearing. Despite these terrible setbacks and disappointments and losses, early Christians acknowledged, and modern-day Christians reaffirm, His call to the light of His

Saint Paul in his Letter to the Philippians acknowledges his confidence in the Advent glory working through those who believe in Christ. He who began a good work in us will continue to complete it until the day of His return. We are called to live in that same faith, with complete confidence.

The Gospel today from Saint Luke puts the figure of John the Baptist in front of us. John calls us to repent and await the coming Messiah. Like John, you and I are called to be a "voice crying in the wilderness," calling out that God is present, and that God is here for the salvation of the world. We should be able to proclaim from the depth of our hearts: all flesh shall see the salvation of God. My dear friends, we are called to be witnesses that God has touched our lives and has come expressly for the salvation of our world. The call of salvation is here in our midst. Let us live in faith and confidence: God will complete His work. And, let us live our lives in this Advent season, and beyond, in a way as to more fruitfully receive His call.

Joy & Generosity

Two years ago, I had a significant birthday. I asked friends and family to instead of giving me gifts, to donate money to St. Anthony's Boys Village in Davao City (SABV-Davao), located in the Southern Island (Mindanao) of the Philippines. (1,476 Km from Manila)

It was highly likely that my altruistic desire was fuelled by my longing to experience joy in my life. My friends and family were generous. I've raised over \$2000.00, which was enough to for an orphaned, abandoned or extremely poor boy to be schooled, housed and fed for a year. I felt happy. But did I feel joyful?

I read somewhere that happiness is an "event" feeling. A feeling you feel or experience in a given event in your life, like birthdays, anniversaries, graduations, weddings, new job, new car....the list goes on. Events come and go, as is the feeling of happiness.

What about joy? Richard Rohr says that there are eight pillars of Joy. Four were qualities of the mind: perspective, humility, humour, and acceptance. Four were qualities of the heart: forgiveness, gratitude, compassion, and generosity. He then talks about generosity of spirit, which when practised, we are practicing all eight pillars of Joy.

Two weeks ago, my partner and I had the privilege of visiting the boys at SABV-Davao. The only regret I had was that I didn't visit them sooner. Fr Ronald Masilang, RCJ (Director) invited us to spend time with the boys and toured us around to see the school and facilities.

We stayed for dinner where we provided Tim Tams and ice cream for dessert. The boys rarely have dessert so this was a special treat for them. There was not an abundance of food but it was shared with smiles that could fill an empty stomach and satisfy your whole being.

After dinner, there was a presentation by the

boys. One of the boys was celebrating a birthday and he sang a song while playing the guitar. Good wishes were exchanged and the boy thanked his fellow interns. I could feel the happiness beaming through the room, despite these boys having experienced hardships in their young lives, mostly through diseases called poverty, rejection and abandonment.

The boys thanked us for being there by singing to us some Christmas Carols. They have been practising Christmas songs so that they can visit homes that will welcome them to sing and make a small donation. It's one way for SABV-Davao to raise much needed funds for their daily expenses. The village relies on donations from benefactors. They do not receive any government funding.

They were cheerful and giving their all in their singing and dancing! I was so overwhelmed that I joined them! Their generosity of spirit is infectious to say the least. Again, did I experience joy?

Richard Rohr talks about people who have a desire to help others who are in need. He calls this a generosity that is "wise-selfish", a generosity that recognises helping others as helping ourselves.

Yes, I experienced joy. I am experiencing joy. A wise-selfish joy. After seeing, experiencing and spending time with the boys at SABV Davao, I know that my pledge to help them in any way I can, it is ultimately my way of discovering my own joy. A joy that comes from a loving God who wants me to experience joy and excitement in the sharing and caring for others.


